Due to circumstances around COVID-19, LEAs may not be able to fully expend their 2019/20 Perkins allocation. The U.S. Secretary initiated a formal request to extend the expenditure deadline or carryover funds into the next fiscal year. CDE is waiting for a decision from the federal government.</li> <li>Q4 Perkins budget revisions deadline is June 30 and claim is July 31. The deadline for the 2020/21 Perkins application is extended to June 15. On May 8, the application was presented to the California Workforce Pathways Joint Advisory Committee (CWPJAC) for review. Additional guidance and/or revisions from the committee, regarding the application, may be forthcoming.</li> </ul>
